


To contribute to economic adaptation and recovery of **micro- and small enterprises (MSMEs)** affected by multiple crises in Ukraine by strengthening their capacity to operate and provide critically needed goods and services for IDPs and host communities.

Through the project, IOM will support micro- and small enterprises with grants and consultancy services, geared towards restarting and sustaining business activity, mitigating the economic impact of the war, retaining existing jobs and creating new work opportunities. In addition, the project will engage diaspora to support the recovery of the country and the targeted enterprises, including through skills development, business support, access to finance, networks and markets. Ultimately, the project aims to support efforts of the Government of Ukraine (GoU) to plan and coordinate the country's economic recovery.
