



DID YOU HAVE TO LEAVE UKRAINE DUE TO THE WAR?

REMEMBER ABOUT YOUR SAFETY AND FOLLOW
THESE RULES:



Try to find information in advance about available help and support services for migrants in the destination country. If possible, contact government or non-governmental organizations.



Take photos of all your important documents and send them to your email — so you will almost always have access to them.



Trust your documents only to border guards and police. Do not leave your passport as guarantee, for paperwork or registration, or for other reasons.



Make sure you have enough information about who you are going with and where, where and with whom you will stay, for how long. Share this information with those you trust.



Try to keep in touch with your family or friends, immediately report a change of location.



Agree with family or friends on a code word or phrase that will tell you that you are in danger.



If you are in danger, call the local emergency services and contact the Ukrainian embassy in the host country.
